During the years of bloody war through which we have passed, many of us have experienced trouble of no ordinary character. And now that the war-cloud has passed away, we still feel the pressings of weighty trouble - pecuniary ruin, religious declension seems to have become the inheritance of all. But it is ⁱⁿ ~~in~~ among the nations, and kind in the Church, and will ^{surely} ~~surely~~ bring good out of the evil, which ^{will} ~~will~~ be to our present ^{benefit} ~~benefit~~.

We have lost during the year a most estimable and useful man - John Gatorough who for many years was a Deacon of this Church - his walk and conversation indicated the high order of his piety, and judging from the fruits of his life, we regard him as having gone to the rest remaining to the people of God.

We have found it very difficult to secure ministerial labour. Last year our house was closed, congregation scattered and the Church suffered. This year, we have enjoyed the labours of our Bro Rev I T Zesty. Under his ministrations the congregation have become good again, and our prospects for the future are brightening. But having the care of two other Churches he finds it impossible to attend our meetings as regularly as is necessary in order to our increase & prosperity.
