



In consequence of the absence of the clerk  
for the most of the time, from the neighborhood,  
the church record has been suspended from  
11<sup>th</sup> of July 1869 to the present time, Brother  
Corley, however, continuing to serve us to the end  
of last year. From the 1<sup>st</sup> of Jan. last to the 1<sup>st</sup>  
of July we had no regular pastor but were indebted  
to the transient visits of ministerial brethren for  
pastoral services. By an arrangement made with the  
Little River and Rock Creek Churches we have  
secured the services of Bro. A. M. Cartledge from  
the 1<sup>st</sup> of July to the end of the year. The days for  
preaching are the third Sunday of one month and  
the fourth of the next alternately.
